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


Volunteering Matters - leading UK volunteering in policy and practice

We facilitate exchange, foster collaboration and carry out research and advocacy, at national and European levels.




















Our Report "Apathy or Action: Young Europeans Take a Stand", 2017






Will your life be better than your parents'?

In fact, most young people are unhappy with the political offer rather than disinterested in politics in general

Around 92-94 million Europeans over the age of 15 volunteer, so that's around 23% of the EU population

Volunteering engagement for European youth is a pathway to personal and professional skills development

However, there continue to exist barriers to youth engagement

- Prejudicial narratives about and representation of youth
- Material and psychological poverty
- Normative assumptions around what constitutes legitimate social participation
- Lack of, or different levels, of using tools and methodologies for recognising, validating and promoting personal and professional skills gained through volunteering

That's why the EuroVIP Project has been so important for the partnership, in order to raise awareness of and promote the integration of employability of young people through recognising their skills developed through volunteering




- An initiative with great potential but needs to be properly managed and have a concerted action across the EU Institutions and all sectors
- Needs to prominently involve the voluntary sector, particularly in the volunteering strand, in the design and delivery of the programme
- To reach the ambitious targets of 100,000 ESC participants in 2020, major engagement of all relevant stakeholders and especially the civil society and voluntary sector in the coproduction, implementation and monitoring of ESC is required
- So far, more than 58,000 young persons have registered their interest in ESC
- Just over 4,100 placed in projects since December 2016

- Volunteering needs to be defined in a way which reflects the vast diversity of volunteering in Europe, something that was showcased so strongly already back in the 2011 European Year of Volunteering
- Volunteering should describe all types of volunteering, in different settings, formal, informal and non-formal
- This would help create a further and stronger distinction from the employment strand placements
- The use of excellent tools such as the Portfolio based on ProfilPass developed by the EuroVIP Project should be really encouraged and incorporated into ESC















We need a strong European volunteering infrastructure for young people in Europe (and for volunteers of all ages!), which recognises and validates the personal and professional skills acquired through this most visible expression of active citizenship
